In the letter of Paul the apostle to the Romans, the biblical image pictures the Earth as a Mother, groaning as in childbirth (Rom 8:22). Francis of Assisi understood this when he referred to the Earth as our sister and our mother in his Canticle of Creatures. The times we live in show that we are not relating to the Earth as a gift from our Creator, but rather as a resource to be used. And yet, there is hope for a better future. To hope in a biblical context does not mean to stand still and quiet, but rather by our groaning, crying, and actively striving for new life amidst the struggle. Just as in childbirth, we will go through a period of intense pain, but new life springs forth.

The Epistle (Romans 8: 18-27, NRSVUE)

A reading from the Letter to the Beloved Community in Rome

I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God, for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its enslavement to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. We know that the whole creation has been groaning together as it suffers together the pains of labour, and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope, for who hopes for what one already sees? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness, for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with groanings too deep for words. And God, who searches hearts, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

Throughout all ages, as mountains dance and trees applaud, the cries of birth are also loud for all to hear and tend. Your Sabbath and Jubilee made space for all Creation's refreshment. But we made exceptions. Your People sought milk and honey, yet injustice laid lands to waste. Your prophets: priests, protestors and farmers call us to account. Yet your loving signs of warning fall often by the wayside. As greed and pride inspire harmful choices knowingly embraced, still comes the Human One, Christ Jesus, friend of wildlife, beloved of the poor, walking upon the seas teaching with rocks and trees, listening to the wild wind of the Spirit. With Christ we hear the groans of Creation and with Christ we embrace the cross of redemptive healing. Filled with hope, we join in Creation's unceasing song:

(chanting) Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might heaven and earth are full of your glory - hosanna in the highest.. Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Triune God, our sustainer, giver of all good things: receive this food and drink we offer, this flesh and blood that we are. As Jesus did, so do we: We break this bread (bread is broken). We share this wine (cup is raised)

We put our trust in the one who died, rose, and will come again. (chanting) Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The bread is gluten-free. It may contain dairy and/or almond flour. (If you'd like a dairy or nut free option, please let the presider know - we have Gluten-free sealed hosts as well). Grape juice is in the small cups. Wine is in the common cup. We discourage 'intinction' (dipping) the bread in the cup due to health concerns.

<u>New Partnership with QomQem : Call for Food Donations</u>

We're now welcoming food donations for AbbeyChurch/Emmaus partnership with QomQem coastal connections - an indigenous harm reduction organisation. We'll be using this food to support their street outreach on Sunday evenings. Our folk are also welcomed to assist in sandwich prep after church at 5:30pm most Sundays starting **SEPTEMBER 22 (that's REALLY the date)!**

Here is the list of desired items:

- large bags of soft candies to make up mixed candy bags (ie sour keys, cherry blasters etc)
- Large jars of peanut butter, Nutella or jam
- Tins of Gatorade powder
- Tins of hot chocolate powder (once it starts to cool)
- Sweet treats like pre wrapped Rice Krispie squares, wagon wheels, ding dongs etc
- Fruit cups
- Flavoured Apple sauce cups
- Soft chew granola bars (nutrigrain, etc)
- Small easy peel oranges and bananas (for Sunday drop-off)
- Gatorade/powerade bottles
- Home baking on the day of starting September 22nd (ideally 150 units)
- Sunscreen, batteries, flashlights

Up to 150 people served each night, so bulk family/sized items appreciated. We now have a treasure chest at the back of the church for collection. Thanks for any help you can be in this amazing work.
